For pieces 24,25, fold them over on each other lengthwise

These get used to connect the head fin ends with the head ribbon ends

In order to connect the head fin ends, ribbons, and head ribbon ends

You may have to get creative. Inserting the ribbons into the pieces

before closing them is one way, or rounding the end of the ribbons

to mold onto the pieces is another.

For the body pieces, be sure to match the numbers to each other.

1 to 1, 2 to 2, etc

The body fins always connect to the non-pink bubble body segments

in the areas with the shaded lines

To fully assemble all the fins, I strongly

suggest having a picture of Mega Rayquaza handy,

such as the one on the following page.

The fins are broken down and flat here, to all fit

into a template easily, so they don't show the assembly well.

Glue 113 and 114 back to back

Then glue 115 and 116 back to back on top of 113/114,

so that the orange rectangle end

is glued inside of 115/116 on the orange round end

Glue 117 and 118 back to back

Then glue 119 and 120 back to back on top of 117/118,

so that the orange rectangle end

is glued inside of 119/120 on the orange round end

For all the Mouth fin ribbon sections, one of the remaining

rectangular ends should mold over the yellow Mouth fin end sections.

The other rectangular end gets glued onto the Mouth fin, off 14 or 19

If you would like better flexibility and shape,

it's advisable to glue wire inside each of the ribbon pieces.

This will allow it to be rigid and shapable.
